

Maori Performing Arts

Level 1

Te kawa tapu ā rangi

Course Requirements:

This course is only available to Puutake students. Maori Performing Arts (MPA) Level 1 builds on the year 10 Marae Kaupapa – Te kawa tapu ā nuku programme and is an integrated programme with Te Reo Maori. Students need to be available to participate and contribute to kaupapa Maori on the school marae.

Aims:

The main focus of the course is around strengthening skills in:

- Group performance (NCEA Level 1)
- Understanding the disciplines and events (NCEA Level 1)
- Pronunciation and mita o te reo waiata (NCEA Level 3)
- Perform a repertoire of dances (NCEA Level 3)

Course Content:

This course aims to build student knowledge in tikanga Maori, te reo Maori and Maori performing arts. They will be offered NCEA Level 1 and 3 Unit Standards. This course will also offer NCEA Level 1, 2 and 3 Achievement Standards.

Where can this subject take you?

Success in the Level 1 MPA course can provide students with a pathway to NCEA Level 2 Maori performing arts where students study at a tertiary level.

Further Assessment Opportunity and Resubmission (Refer to student Handbook for more information)

A further assessment opportunity occurs after you have submitted work / sat a test for an assessment; you do a new assessment after further learning has taken place. For this course there will be one further assessment opportunity for each standard. A resubmission can be offered to you by the teacher if they believe you can correct errors or omissions in your work in a short period of time; it does not involve a new assessment. A resubmission must take place before the teacher gives any feedback on the work done. There can be only one resubmission.

Appeals (Please refer to student Handbook for more information)

If you are unhappy with any of your results you should discuss this with your teacher. If you are still unhappy then an Appeals form should be completed; this is available from the HoF; forms need to be completed and returned to your HoF within 5 school days of receiving your grade. If you are still not happy you can then see the Principal's Nominee. At NO time, during this process, should you contact NZQA.

22756 Perform a Maori Performing Arts bracket is a Level 3 standard which needs to be an event performance such as ASB Polyfest, a performance in the community or a public performance.

91591, 91592 and 91207 are Dance Achievement Standards at Levels 2 & 3 which are judged on the basis of rehearsals and performances.
