

# Te Reo Maori

# Level 1

## Course Requirements:

This course is only available to Puutake students. Te Reo Māori Level 1 builds on the year 9 and 10 Te Reo Maori programme. Students need to be reading, writing, listening and speaking at Level 4 of Te Aho Arataki I Te Marau (TAAM) or proficient in Te Reo Māori.

## Aims:

This course aims to build student knowledge in the four language strands of tuhituhi, pānui, korero & whakarongo at Level 5-6 of the NZ curriculum and at Level 1 NCEA assessment standard.

## Course Content:

The main focus of the course is around strengthening skills in:

- Reading
- Writing
- Speaking
- Listening

## Where can this subject take you?

Success in the Level 1 Te Reo Maori course can provide students with a step toward completing NCEA Level 1 and entry to NCEA Level 2 Te Reo Maori. Those who complete the Panui & Tuhituhi standards give themselves the chance to gain the compulsory 10 credits required for Literacy Level 1.

## Further Assessment Opportunity and Resubmission

(Refer to student Handbook for more information)

A further assessment opportunity occurs after you have submitted work / sat a test for an assessment; you do a new assessment after further learning has taken place.

For this course there will be one further assessment opportunity for each standard.

A resubmission can be offered to you by the teacher if they believe you can correct errors or omissions in your work in a short period of time; it does not involve a new assessment. A resubmission must take place before the teacher gives any feedback on the work done. There can be only one resubmission.

## Appeals (Please refer to student Handbook for more information)

If you are unhappy with any of your results you should discuss this with your teacher. If you are still unhappy then an Appeals form should be completed; this is available from the HoF; forms need to be completed and returned to your HoF within 5 school days of receiving your grade. If you are still not happy you can then see the Principal's Nominee. At NO time, during this process, should you contact NZQA.

An individual programme will be developed for each student which will incorporate a selection of the standards listed.

### Entry into externals will be based on:

- 1) achievement levels in 91089 Waihanga Tuhinga and Panui work in class. If students do not gain at least an achieved in the written pieces, entry into the exam at the end of the year is not advised.
- 2) Attendance to class. If attendance to class during the year is poor then the teacher will not enter students into the external standards.
