Tourism Level 3

Course Requirements:

Students who are: reliable (especially having a good attendance), hard-working, able to work independently and have an interest in working in the tourism and travel industry, should have no trouble in achieving success in this subject. Good computer research skills and the ability to read and summarise information will also be of benefit.

Aims:

To cover Unit Standards which all qualify for the New Zealand Certificate of Tourism. To cover the knowledge and skills necessary for further study in the tourism field. Also, for students to learn how to research specific information for the tourism and travel industry.

To motivate students to further their studies in tourism. There is a possibility of an overseas trip to Vietnam.

Course Content:

The course covers projects which focus on tourism and travel in Australia and Pacific Island countries (Samoa, Cook Islands & Fiji), as well as a key New Zealand tourist destination (Auckland). We will also be covering aspects of world geography relevant to the tourism and travel industry.

Where can this subject take you?

After completing their studies at JCHS, students can carry on their studies to Level 4 and Level 5, by attending a technical institute, or any of the various tourism travel colleges found in Auckland. They could also go straight into the tourism job market.

Further Assessment Opportunity and Resubmission (Refer to student Handbook for more information)

A further assessment opportunity occurs after you have submitted work / sat a test for an assessment; you do a new assessment after further learning has taken place. For this course there will be one further assessment opportunity for each standard. A resubmission can be offered to you by the teacher if they believe you can correct errors or omissions in your work in a short period of time; it does not involve a new assessment. A resubmission must take place before the teacher gives any feedback on the work done. There can be only one resubmission.

Appeals (Please refer to student Handbook for more information)

If you are unhappy with any of your results you should discuss this with your teacher. If you are still unhappy then an Appeals form should be completed; this is available from the HoF; forms need to be completed and returned to your HoF within 5 school days of receiving your grade. If you are still not happy you can then see the Principal's Nominee. At NO time, during this process, should you contact NZQA.
