Kia ora koutou,

We had a very successful day with all of our students today – the Years 11, 12 and 13 students with their learning and achievement; and the Year 9 and 10 students who joined us for the first time in 3 months.



Year 9 and 10 Students Returning to School

Today was a very successful day, with **huge thanks** to the staff and students who together made it so.

We had about 170 year 9 and 10 students join us on the first day back for them. Onsite also were 272 Year 11 – 13 students.

The day had to be adapted for wet weather in the morning, and after meet-and-greet included some class time and then some supervised fun activities.

We are well aware that there is a strong social desire amongst the students when they first return, so we are providing for this through supervised games and problem-solving activities.

Tomorrow will start in exactly the same way as today. We are asking Year 9 and 10 students to come into school through the very end gate, straight onto the astro-turf courts and then into the big gym when the bell goes.

There were about 20 students who arrived late this morning, some over an hour late.

Whānau, if you would like some support ensuring that your beautiful child goes to bed, or gets up, at the right time please just ask. I am always happy to call past for a home visit and enjoy a quick tea or coffee with a parent or caregiver. I'll even bring some biscuits!

After some quick administration, and putting new students into their class groups the day will start, again with classwork then the last afternoon of supervised games and problem-solving activities.



Both of these things are **not** just a rule we made up for ourselves, they are **the law**. Set out in Public Health Orders, MOE regulations and MOE directions to schools.


From Gate 1 (nearest to Leabank School) There is a pedestrian entrance to our front office/reception area. Please use this when you call in.
