
ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

ESOL programmes teach English to people whose first language is not English, but who live in an English speaking country and require English to communicate in daily life.

We have many students from migrant families at our school. We provide ESOL classes to offer extra English language learning support. This programme is designed to help students with their learning in the classroom.



Who qualifies for ESOL assistance?

ESOL is targeted at students with English language learning needs. To qualify the student must have a level of English language proficiency below that of a native speaker. Your child's achievement will be assessed in listening, speaking, reading and writing to see if they qualify for specialised help.

Students will be eligible for ESOL support if they are:

- Migrants to New Zealand
- From a refugee background
- New Zealand-born students, with at least 1 parent of migrant or refugee background, and a language other than English is spoken in the home.
